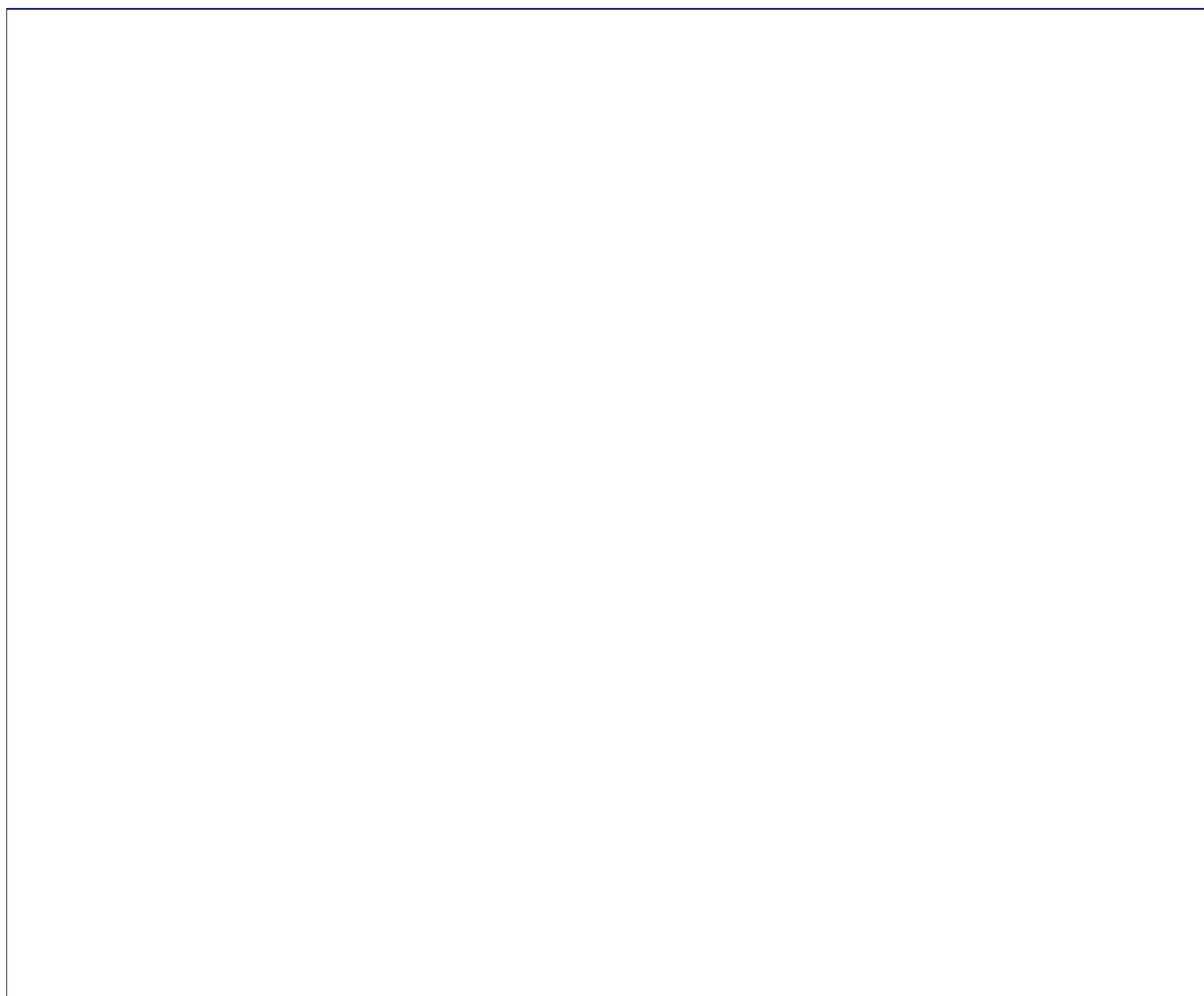


Pip's Storytelling Garden

Learning objective: To develop creative writing skills by visualising a story setting and using descriptive vocabulary to label features.

Pip the bookworm caterpillar is looking for a place to write a new story. Use your imagination to draw a magical garden where stories grow on trees! Once you have finished your drawing, use the words in the word bank to label the different parts of your scene.

Draw: Draw a large, friendly garden scene. Include a 'story-tree' with books instead of leaves, a small cosy house for Pip the caterpillar, and a winding path. The style should be bright, colourful, and whimsical, using crayons or coloured pencils. Add sparkles around the tree to show it is magical.



Label words: caterpillar · blossom · glowing · pathway · story-tree · sparkle

Steps:

1. Draw a home for Pip the caterpillar in the middle of your garden.
2. What colour is the magic story-tree? Write a short sentence describing it.
3. If Pip found a golden coin worth £1 in the garden, what might he buy to help him write more stories? Draw it next to Pip.
4. Label two things in your drawing using the words from the word bank.

5. Give your story garden a special name. Write it at the top of your page.
