

Diwali: The Festival of Light

Learning objective: To understand the key elements of the Diwali story and explain why it is celebrated as a festival of light.

Read the sentences carefully and answer the questions below. Use the word bank to help you with your spelling.

Diwali is a special festival celebrated by many people. The story of Diwali tells us about Rama and Sita returning home after a long time away. The people of their city were very happy to see them. It was a dark, moonless night, so the people lit many small oil lamps called diyas to light up the path and guide them home. This showed that light is stronger than darkness, and that good will always win. Today, people celebrate by lighting lamps, sharing delicious sweets, and spending time with their families.

1. What are the small oil lamps used during Diwali called? (1 mark)

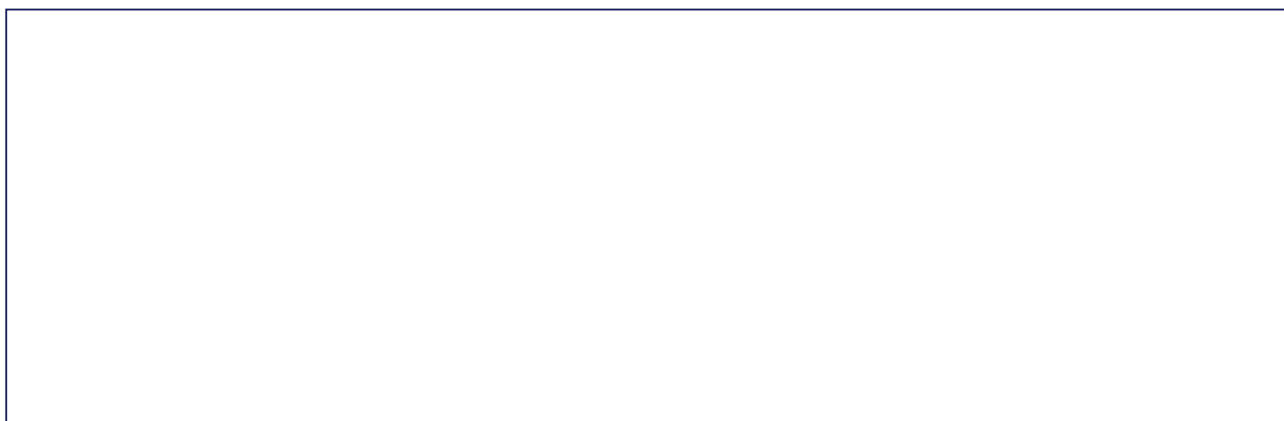
2. Why did the people in the story light the lamps for Rama and Sita? (2 marks)
