

Max's Maths Shop: A Grammar Adventure

Learning objective: To identify and use different word classes (nouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs) to describe objects in a shop.

Max the monkey is opening a shop to sell his favourite maths puzzles. He needs your help to label his stock! Look at the list of words in the word bank. Sort them into the correct category below. Remember: a noun is a thing, a verb is an action, an adjective describes a noun, and an adverb describes how an action is done.

Word bank: shiny · count · quickly · pencil · carefully · ruler · calculate · bright · softly · book

1. Find two nouns from the word bank and write them here. (2 marks)

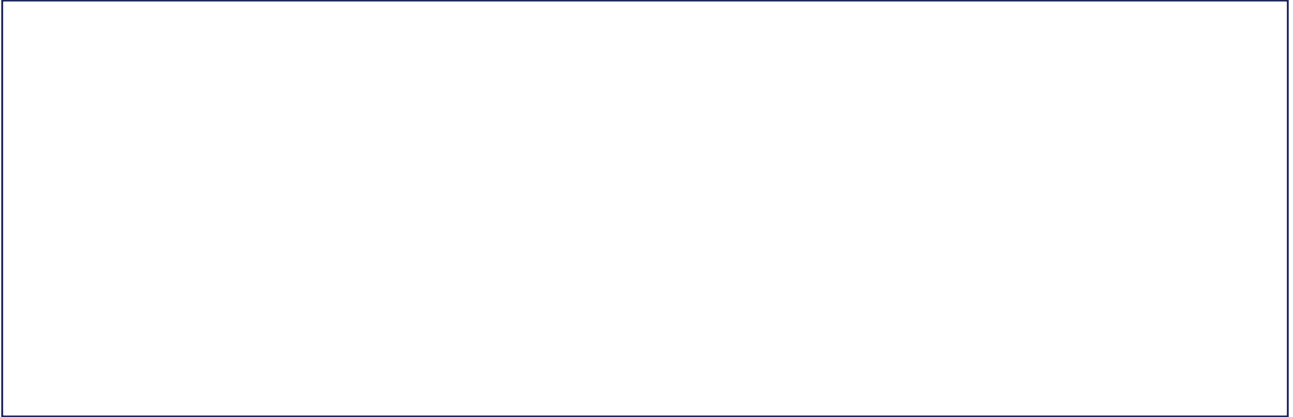
2. Find two verbs (doing words) from the word bank and write them here. (2 marks)

3. Find two adjectives (describing words) from the word bank and write them here. (2 marks)

4. Find two adverbs (words ending in -ly that describe how we do something) from the word bank and write them here. (2 marks)

5. Choose one word from each category to write a sentence about Max's shop. (Example: The shiny pencil writes carefully.) (2 marks)

Draw: Draw Max the monkey standing behind a shop counter. On his counter, draw a shiny ruler, a bright book, and a pencil. Label your drawing using one noun and one adjective.



Extension challenge: Can you think of one more adverb that describes how Max works? Hint: Max is a very clever monkey!
