4. Reflecting on Progress: Compare and contrast your writing from the start of the year with your current work. What specific improvements have you made to your letter sizing? (3 marks)

5. Creative Expression: If you were to design a new style of calligraphy, what features would it have? Describe your ideal alphabet design... (3 marks)

6. The Future of Writing: What might happen if we stopped using handwriting altogether and relied only on technology? Explain why you think handwriting will or will not remain important... (3 marks)
