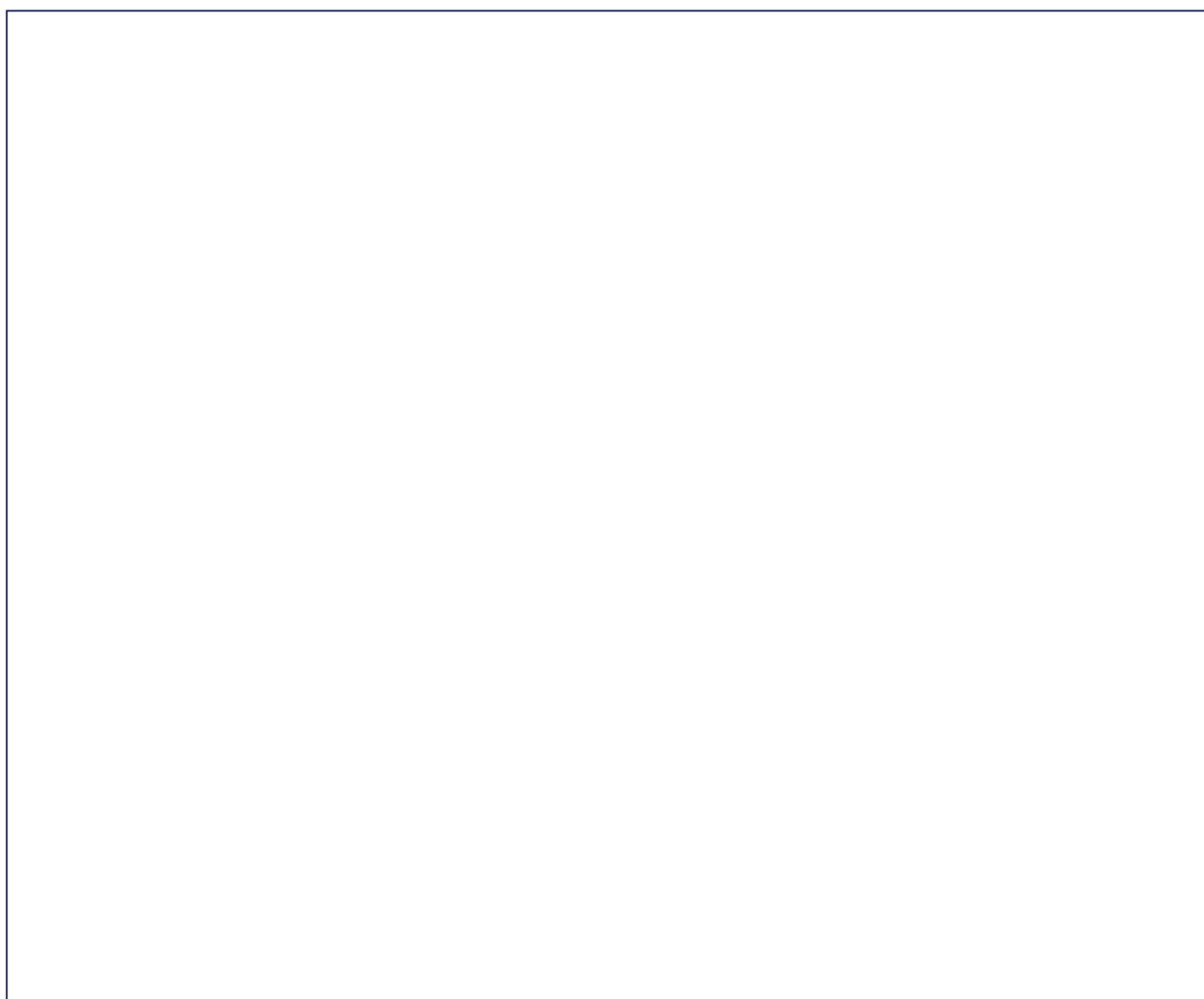


Myths and Legends: Crafting Your Own Mythical World

Learning objective: To use descriptive vocabulary to design a mythical creature and setting inspired by traditional folklore, while justifying creative choices.

Use your imagination to bring a legend to life! Follow the drawing prompt to build your scene, then use the word bank to label your creation. Finally, answer the challenge questions to explain the history behind your mythical world.

Draw: Create a detailed illustration of a mythical creature in its natural habitat. Use a 'storyteller's style'—ensure the lines are clean and the details are intricate. Include elements like glowing plants, ancient stone ruins, or swirling mists to create an atmosphere of mystery. Draw the creature in a pose that shows its personality, such as guarding a relic, flying through clouds, or hiding among roots.

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw your mythical creature in the centre of the page. Ensure it has at least three distinct features that suggest it possesses magical abilities. Label these features.
2. Step 2: Draw the environment where your creature lives. Describe why this specific setting is important to

the creature's legend.

3. Explain why your creature chooses to hide from the human world. What might happen if a human were to discover their secret?
4. Compare and contrast your creature with a traditional dragon or griffin. How are their powers similar or different?
5. Justify your choice of habitat. Why is this landscape the only place your creature can survive?
6. If your creature had a 'talisman' (a magical object they carry), what would it be and what power would it grant them?
