

Mastering Paragraphs with Kit the Fox

Learning objective: To understand how to use paragraphs to organise information and show shifts in time, place, or topic.

Kit the Fox is writing a story about his latest computing adventure, but he has accidentally jumbled his paragraphs! Read the scrambled sentences below. Your task is to sort them into three distinct paragraphs by identifying the theme of each. Write the paragraph number (1, 2, or 3) next to each sentence to show where it belongs.

Theme 1: Setting the scene at the library.

Theme 2: Finding a tricky puzzle.

Theme 3: Solving the puzzle and feeling proud.

Word bank: Paragraph · Structure · Chronological · Cohesion · Topic sentence · Organise

1. A) Kit sat at his wooden desk in the quiet library, surrounded by towers of dusty books and glowing computer screens. (Write the paragraph number here) (1 mark)

2. B) Suddenly, a complex coding puzzle appeared on his monitor, featuring a maze of neon blue wires and blinking lights. (Write the paragraph number here) (1 mark)

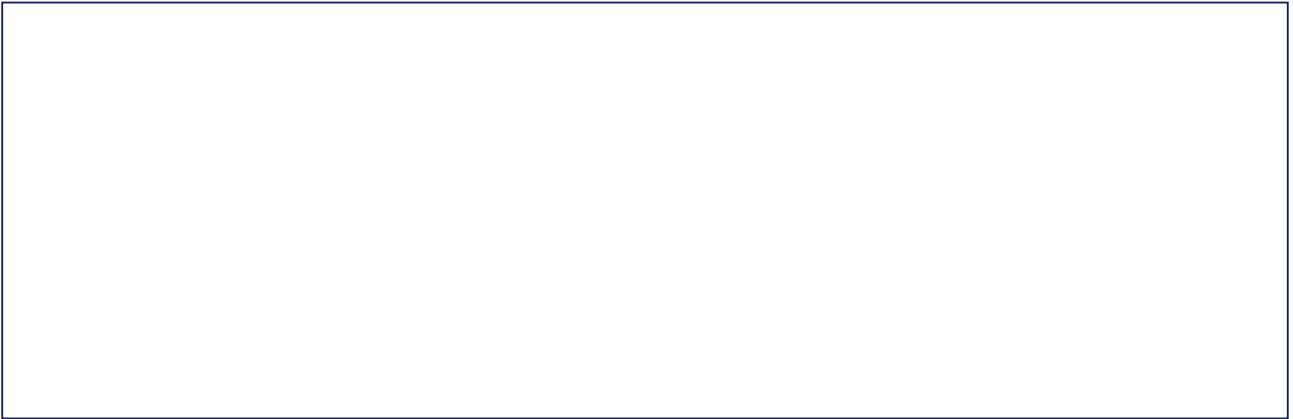
3. C) The library was silent, except for the soft rustle of pages and the distant ticking of the old grandfather clock in the corner. (Write the paragraph number here) (1 mark)

4. D) With a quick click, Kit typed the final command, and the screen flashed a brilliant golden colour as the puzzle unlocked. (Write the paragraph number here) (1 mark)

5. E) He leaned closer to the screen, his sharp eyes darting between the confusing sequences of numbers that didn't seem to make sense. (Write the paragraph number here) (1 mark)

6. F) Feeling a wave of satisfaction, Kit closed his laptop and smiled, ready to share his clever solution with his friends. (Write the paragraph number here) (1 mark)

Draw: Draw a picture of Kit the Fox sitting at his desk in the library, looking at his computer screen. Make sure your drawing reflects the 'tech-savvy' atmosphere of his workspace.



Extension challenge: Write a fourth paragraph for Kit's story. Use a transition word (such as 'meanwhile', 'afterwards', or 'furthermore') to show how the story moves forward after he finishes his puzzle.
