

Year 1 Reading Assessment: Pip's Library Adventure

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding of a short text, extract information, and use inference to answer questions.

Read the story carefully and answer the questions below. Use your best handwriting and remember your capital letters and full stops.

Pip is a small, green caterpillar who loves reading books. One sunny morning, Pip crawled into the big, wooden library. The library was full of tall shelves and colourful books. Pip found a book about a forest. He started to read about a brave lion named Leo who liked to write poetry. Pip felt very happy. He sat on a soft red cushion and turned the pages with his tiny feet. Suddenly, Max the monkey swung by the window. 'Would you like to play, Pip?' asked Max. Pip smiled and shook his head. 'Not today, Max,' said Pip. 'I am on a reading adventure!'

5. How do you think Pip felt while he was reading his book? Give a reason for your answer using words from the text. (4 marks)

6. Imagine you are in the library with Pip. Write 3 or 4 sentences about a book you would like to read together. Tell me what the book is about and why you chose it. (5 marks)

7. If Pip wanted to buy a new bookmark that cost £2, and he had a £5 note, how much change would he get back? (3 marks)
