Learning objective: To retrieve information, make inferences, and explain vocabulary choices in a narrative text.

5. Why does the author describe the market as a 'giant maths puzzle'? Use evidence from the story to support your answer. (4 marks)

6. Max bought four apples for 80p. If he wanted to buy two more apples, how much more money would he need to give the farmer? (2 marks)

7. Imagine Max is going to buy a bunch of bananas for £1.20. Write a short paragraph describing how Max would feel about this purchase and how he would check he has enough money. (5 marks) (5 marks)
