

World Book Day Assessment

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding of narrative structure, character development, and personal responses to reading.

Read the story of Pip the Bookworm carefully. Answer all questions in full sentences where possible. Use your best handwriting and check your spellings.

Pip the caterpillar lives in a giant, hollowed-out oak tree that serves as a forest library. Every World Book Day, Pip collects new words like colourful autumn leaves. This year, Pip wants to write a story about a brave explorer. He remembers his friend Finn the dolphin telling him about the deep blue sea, and his friend Nova the owl describing the twinkling stars. Pip spends the whole morning writing. He decides that his story will be about a tiny star that falls into the ocean. Pip is so proud of his work that he invites all his friends to the oak tree to read it aloud. They share snacks and celebrate the magic of stories together.

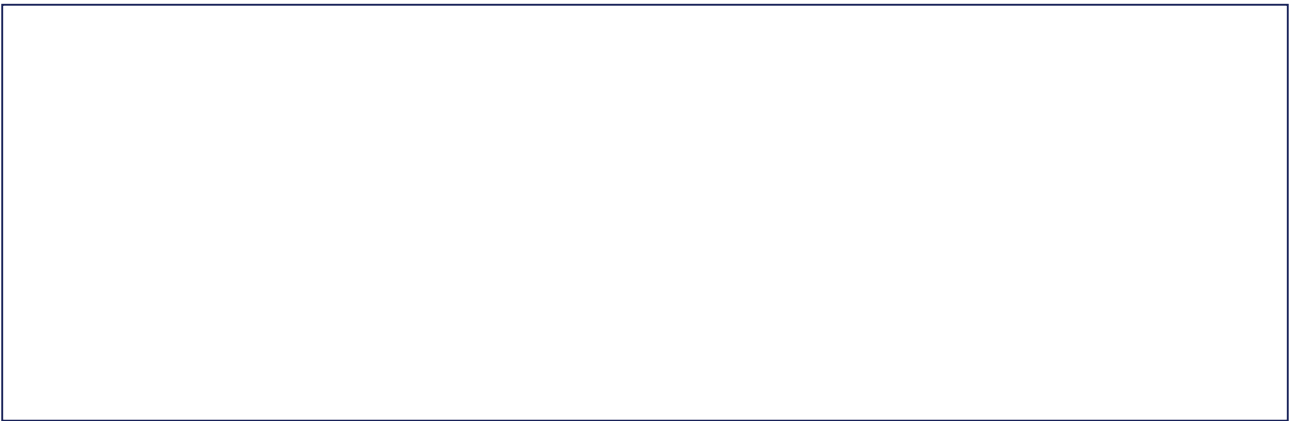
3. Which two characters help Pip with ideas for his story? (2 marks) (2 marks)
