

Ma Famille: Rosa's Family Tree

Join Rosa the parrot as we learn to describe our family members in French—let's get chatting!

- To introduce your mother, you say 'C'est ma mère'.
- To introduce your father, you say 'C'est mon père'.
- The word for grandmother is 'la grand-mère' and grandfather is 'le grand-père'.
- If you have a sibling, you use 'mon frère' for a brother and 'ma sœur' for a sister.
- The phrase 'Voici ma famille' means 'Here is my family'.

Did you know? Did you know? In French, family nouns have a gender! We use 'le' for masculine nouns like 'le père' and 'la' for feminine nouns like 'la mère'. When you talk about 'my' family, we use 'mon' before masculine words and 'ma' before feminine words. For example, you would say 'mon frère' but 'ma sœur'!
