

Rosa's Number Challenge: Assessment de Français

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding of numbers 1-20 and apply them within simple shopping and quantity contexts.

Read each question carefully. You may use the word bank to help you. Write your answers clearly in English or French as requested.

Rosa the parrot is at the local market. She is buying items for her friends. She buys 4 apples, 12 pencils, and 15 stickers. She also has £20 to spend.

Word bank: un · deux · trois · quatre · cinq · six · sept · huit · neuf · dix · onze · douze · treize · quatorze · quinze · seize · dix-sept · dix-huit · dix-neuf · vingt

1. Translate the following numbers into French: a) 7, b) 13, c) 19. (3 marks)

2. If Rosa buys 4 apples and 6 oranges, how many pieces of fruit does she have in total? Write the number in French. (2 marks)

3. Rosa sees an item priced at £11. Write this price in words using French numbers. (2 marks)

4. Explain why it is useful to know numbers in a different language when visiting a market in France. Give two reasons. (4 marks)

5. Compare the numbers 'seize' and 'six'. How are they similar in spelling, and how do they differ in value? Justify your answer. (4 marks)

6. Rosa has £20. She spends £8 on a book and £5 on seeds. How much money does she have left? Write the calculation and the final amount in French words. (5 marks)

7. What might happen if Rosa miscounted her money and thought she had 'dix' pounds when she actually had 'seize' pounds? Justify your answer. (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a market stall with exactly 'quinze' (15) items on display. Label your drawing using French numbers.
