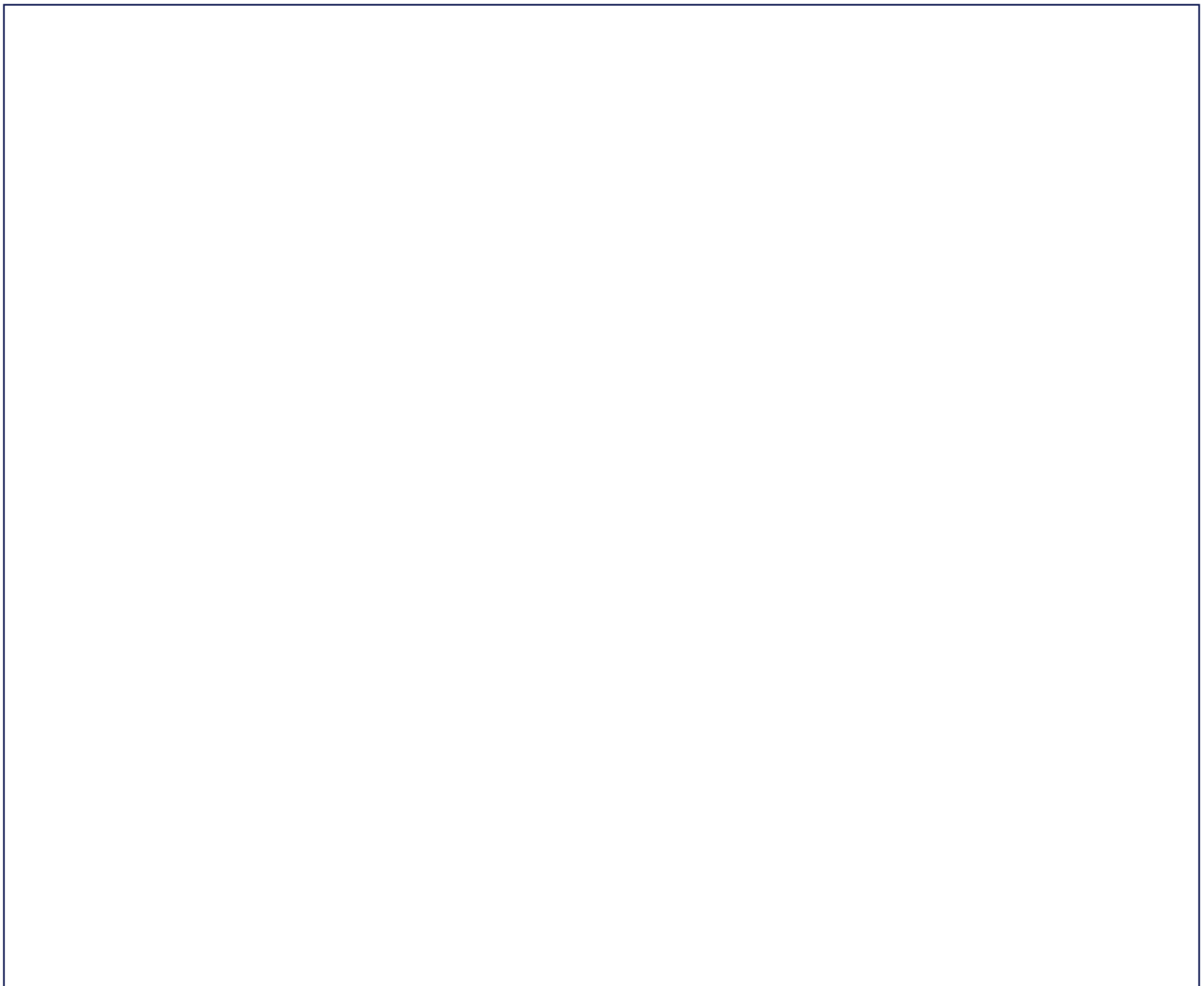


Rosa's Number Garden

Learning objective: To recall and use French numbers from 1 to 20 and apply them to a creative visual scene.

Rosa the parrot is hosting a garden party! Use your knowledge of French numbers to decorate her garden. Follow the drawing steps below, ensuring you label each item with the correct French number word from the word bank.

Draw: Create a vibrant garden scene in a bright, illustrative style. Include a large, sturdy tree with apples, a patch of flowers, a ladybird, and plenty of grass. Ensure all these elements are clearly drawn so that the numbered items can be easily counted by a peer.



Label words: un, deux, trois, quatre, cinq, six, sept, huit, neuf, dix, onze, douze, treize, quatorze, quinze, seize, dix-sept, dix-huit, dix-neuf, vingt

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a large tree. On its branches, draw 'neuf' (9) bright red apples. Label the total number of apples in French.
2. Step 2: Draw 'quatre' (4) colourful flowers in the grass. Label them using the correct French word.
3. Step 3: Draw 'douze' (12) tiny spots on a ladybird sitting on a leaf. Write the number 'douze' next to the ladybird.

4. Step 4: Draw 'vingt' (20) blades of grass at the bottom of your page. Label this quantity in French.
5. Explain why it is important to check your spelling of French numbers, especially when distinguishing between similar words like 'six' and 'dix'.
6. Justify your answer: If Rosa adds 'trois' more apples to her tree of 'neuf', how many would there be in total? Write the number and the French word.
