

French Assessment: Expressing Opinions with Rosa the Parrot

Learning objective: To use French opinion phrases and justifications to express preferences about hobbies and food.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you construct your sentences in French. Ensure your spelling is accurate.

Rosa the parrot is visiting a local school to find out what the students enjoy. She has been listening to their conversations about their favourite hobbies and snacks. To show that you understand how to share your own opinions, complete the following assessment.

Word bank: J'adore (I love) · J'aime (I like) · Je n'aime pas (I do not like) · Je déteste (I hate) · parce que c'est (because it is) · amusant (fun) · ennuyeux (boring) · délicieux (delicious) · facile (easy) · difficile (difficult)

1. Translate the following phrases into English: 'J'adore le football' and 'Je déteste les brocolis'. (2 marks)

2. Rosa asks, 'Tu aimes le tennis?' Write a French response stating that you like tennis because it is fun. (3 marks)

3. Change this sentence to the negative form: 'J'aime les maths.' (2 marks)

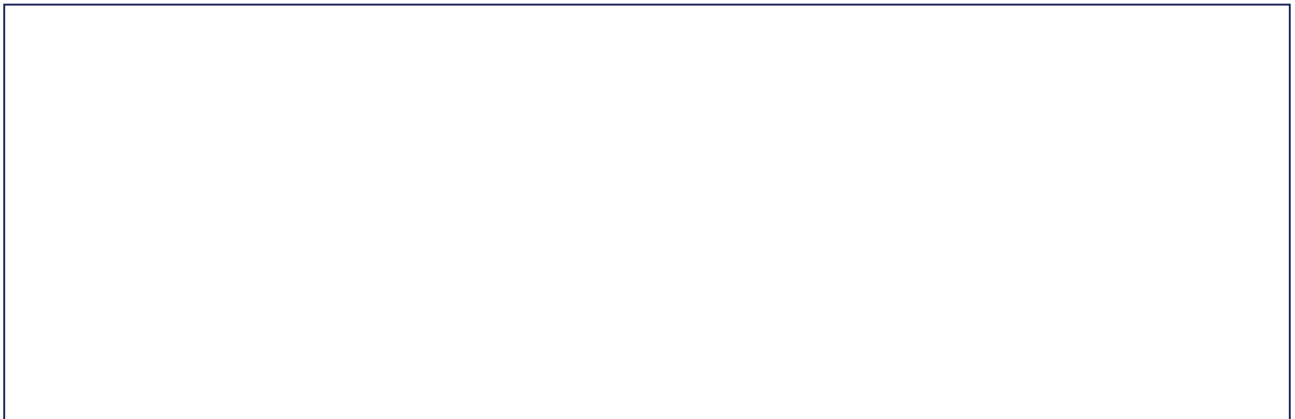
4. Explain in English why we use the word 'parce que' in a French sentence. Give an example of how it changes the sentence structure. (4 marks)

5. Look at these two items: 'le chocolat' and 'la lecture' (reading). Write two full sentences in French expressing your opinion on each, including a reason for your choice. (4 marks)

6. Extended Writing Task: Rosa wants to know about your life. Write a short paragraph in French (4-5 sentences) about what you like and dislike doing at school and why. Use a variety of opinion phrases from the word bank. (5 marks)

7. If a cinema ticket costs £7.50 and you buy two, how much do you spend in total? Write your answer in a full French sentence. (5 marks)
