

Exploring Mountain Landscapes with Finn

Learning objective: To identify and label the physical features of a mountain environment.

Follow the drawing steps to create your own mountain landscape. Once your drawing is complete, use the word bank to label the key features of the mountain.

Draw: Create a landscape scene featuring at least two mountains. Include a snow-capped peak, a glacier, a flowing river, and a valley between the mountains. Use clear, dark lines for your labels so they are easy to read. You may add trees at the base of the mountains to show where the climate changes.



Label words: Summit · Slope · Valley · Snow line · Glacier · River

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a large, jagged triangle shape to represent the main mountain peak. Use a light blue pencil to shade the very top of the peak to show the snow line.
2. Step 2: Draw a winding line starting from the snow line down the side of the mountain to represent a glacier. Add a river flowing from the bottom of the glacier into the valley below.
3. Step 3: Label the highest point of your mountain as the 'Summit'.
4. Step 4: Draw a smaller mountain next to the first one and label the steep side as the 'Slope'.
5. Step 5: Label the low-lying area between your two mountains as the 'Valley'.
