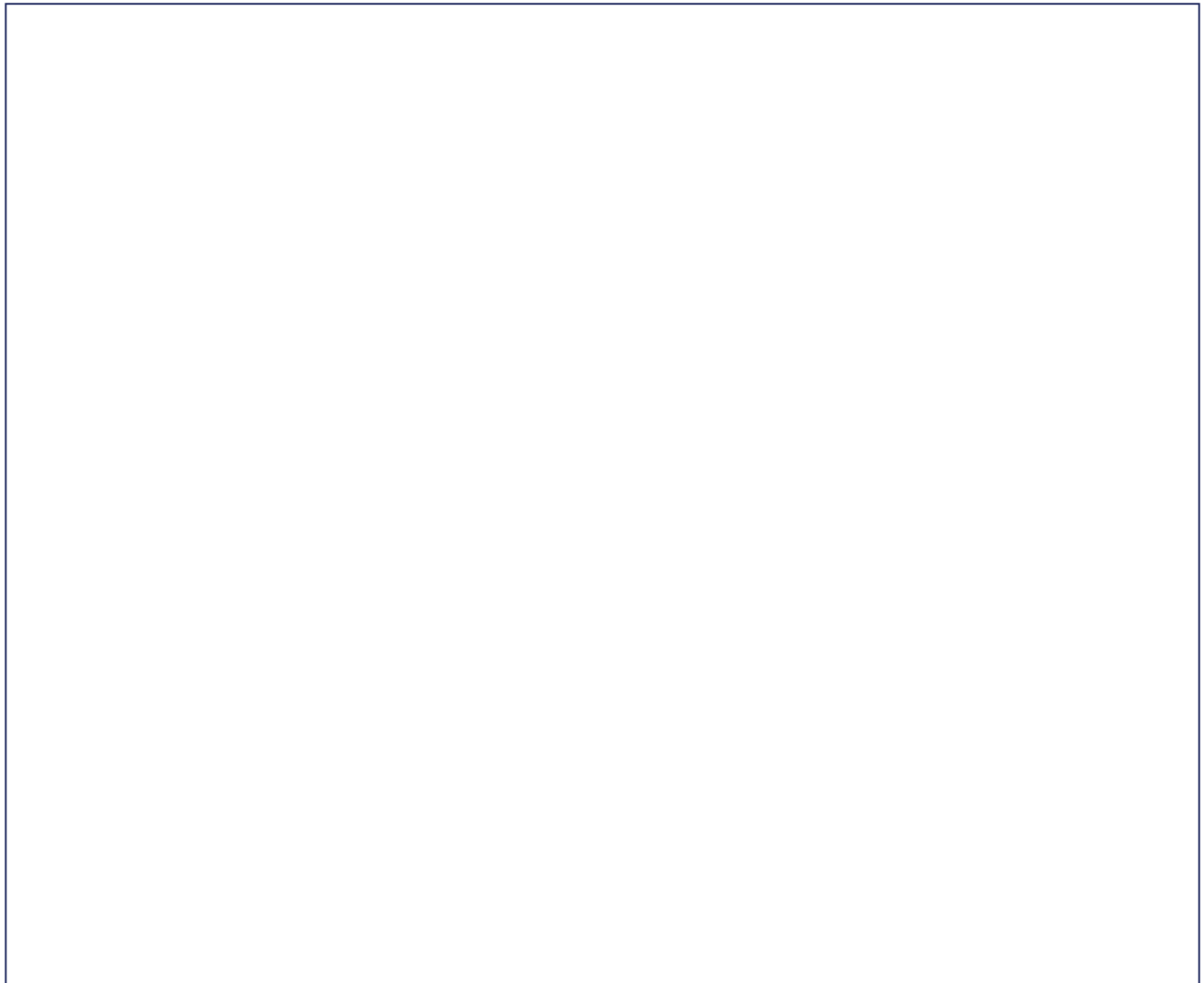


Exploring North America with Finn the Dolphin

Learning objective: To identify and label key geographical features and countries of North America.

Use the word bank to label the map of North America. Add drawings of famous landmarks to the correct locations to show your understanding of the continent's diverse geography.

Draw: Create a large, clear outline map of North America in the centre of your page. Leave plenty of space around the edges for labels. Use a pencil to sketch the borders of Canada, the USA, and Mexico. In the Pacific Ocean, draw a small version of Finn the Dolphin. Use clear, neat lines for your labels, ensuring they point directly to the correct country or body of water.



Label words: Canada · United States of America · Mexico · Rocky Mountains · Arctic Ocean · Atlantic Ocean · Pacific Ocean

Steps:

1. Identify which country is located furthest north on the continent.
2. Name the ocean that lies to the west of North America.
3. Why is it important to use a map key when looking at a map of a continent?
4. Step 1: Draw a tall, snowy mountain range in the western part of the continent to represent the Rocky Mountains.

5. Step 2: Draw a small sun in the south of Mexico to show its warmer climate.
