

Finn's Polar Expedition Drawing Sheet

Learning objective: To identify and draw features of the Polar Regions, understanding that these environments are cold, icy, and home to specific animals.

Follow the drawing steps below to build your own Polar scene. Use your best colours to show the icy landscape. You can use the word bank to label your picture when you have finished.

Draw: Create a landscape scene of a Polar region. Include a large, jagged iceberg in the centre of a deep blue ocean. Draw Finn the dolphin leaping gracefully out of the water. Fill the sky with gentle, falling snow. The style should be bright and colourful, using shades of white, light blue, and deep navy to show the icy environment.



Label words: Iceberg · Snow · Ocean · Finn · Glacier

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a large, bumpy shape in the middle of your page to be a big iceberg. What colour should you colour it?
2. Step 2: Draw Finn the dolphin jumping out of the freezing cold water next to your iceberg.
3. Step 3: Draw lots of little white dots falling from the sky. What do we call this cold weather?
4. Step 4: Label the iceberg and the ocean using the words from the word bank.
5. Question: Why do you think Finn wears a thick layer of blubber to stay warm in the freezing Polar water?
