

Finn's Great Market Adventure

Learning objective: To understand that trade is the act of buying and selling goods, and that different places produce different things.

Help Finn the dolphin explore the market! Use the word bank to help you answer the questions about how we get the things we need.

Finn the dolphin has travelled from the sea to the village market. He sees farmers selling apples, bakers selling bread, and crafters selling handmade hats. People are using £1 coins to buy what they need. This is called trade!

Word bank: money · market · trade · shop · coins · exchange

1. Finn wants to buy an apple that costs £1. What do we use to pay for things at the market? (2 marks)

2. If you go to the market and give the baker money to get a loaf of bread, what is this action called? (2 marks)

3. Why do people go to the market instead of making everything themselves? Tick the best reason. (2 marks)

4. If you had £2, name two different things you might want to buy at a market. (2 marks)

5. Finn sees a farmer selling vegetables. Where do you think the farmer got the vegetables from? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of a market stall. Include a sign showing an item that costs £1 and draw the money you would use to buy it.



Extension challenge: Ask a grown-up about a time they went to a shop. What did they buy, and how much did it cost? Draw a picture of the item they brought home.
