Which emperor ordered the construction of a giant defensive wall across Northern Britain?	What is a 'mosaic' and how did the Romans use them?
Hadrian	A piece of art made from small, coloured tiles (tesserae) used to decorate floors and walls.
What was a large, luxurious country house belonging to a wealthy Roman called?	In what year did the Roman Emperor Claudius successfully invade Britain?
A villa	43 AD
What were the Roman public baths used for?	What was a Roman 'legion'?
Bathing, exercising, relaxing, and socialising.	The main unit of the Roman army, consisting of about 5,000 heavily armed foot soldiers.
What was the name of the Roman settlement that eventually became the city of London?	What is a 'toga'?
Londinium	A long, loose outer garment worn by Roman citizens on formal occasions.
