

Max's Fruit Stall Addition

Learning objective: To add two single-digit numbers and find the total using counting on or number bonds.

Help Max the monkey work out how many pieces of fruit he has for his friends. Use your counting skills to find the totals.

Max is busy at his fruit stall. He has 4 shiny red apples and he finds 3 green pears in his basket. Max also has 5 yellow bananas and his friend gives him 2 more. Max needs your help to count them all up!

Word bank: total · add · plus · equals · more · sum

1. Max has 4 apples and 3 pears. How many pieces of fruit does he have in total? Show your working out. (2 marks)

2. Max has 5 bananas and is given 2 more. Write this as a number sentence: ____ + ____ = ____ (2 marks)

3. If Max has 6 oranges and finds 4 more, does he have more than 10 pieces of fruit? Explain how you know. (2 marks)

4. Max sells a plum for £2 and a peach for £3. How much do they cost altogether? (2 marks)

5. Create your own addition challenge: If you have 7 blueberries and add 2 blackberries, what is the total? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Max the monkey holding 6 red apples in one hand and 4 green pears in the other hand. Write the total number of fruits underneath your drawing.



Extension challenge: Max has 8 plums. He eats 2 of them. How many does he have left? (Hint: This is subtraction!)
