Learning objective: To solve one-step problems involving division by calculating the number of items in each group (sharing equally).

1. 1. Max has 8 bananas. He shares them equally between 2 friends. How many bananas does each friend get? A) 2, B) 4*, C) 6, D) 8 (1 mark)

2. 2. True or False: To divide means to share things into equal groups. (1 mark)

3. 3. If you have 6 stickers and share them equally between 2 children, how many stickers does each child have? (1 mark)

4. 4. Zara has 10 paintbrushes. She puts them into 5 equal pots. How many brushes are in each pot? A) 5, B) 3, C) 2*, D) 1 (1 mark)

5. 5. True or False: When we divide, the groups do not need to be equal. (1 mark)

6. 6. Max has 15 coins (£). He puts them into 3 piles of the same size. How many coins are in each pile? (1 mark)

7. 7. You have 9 cakes. You share them between 3 plates. How many cakes on each plate? A) 3*, B) 4, C) 2, D) 6 (1 mark)

8. 8. True or False: 4 shared by 2 is the same as 2 groups of 2. (1 mark)

9. 9. Max has 4 apples. He shares them between 2 bowls. How many apples in each bowl? (1 mark)

10. 10. Which is the best way to share 12 toys between 3 friends? A) 2 each, B) 3 each, C) 4 each*, D) 5 each (1 mark)

Draw: Draw 8 apples and show how you would share them equally between 2 baskets by drawing a line from each apple to a basket.



Extension challenge: Max has £20 to share between 4 friends. How many pounds (£) does each friend get? Explain how you worked it out to a partner.
