

Max the Monkey's Market Maths

Learning objective: To understand place value by grouping objects into tens and ones using British currency.

Max the Monkey is at the market! Help him sort his fruit by grouping them into bags of ten and loose pieces. Fill in the boxes to show how many items he has in total. Remember: 10 ones make 1 ten.

Word bank: tens · ones · total · group · count · value

1. Max has 1 bag of ten apples and 3 loose apples. Write the number of tens and the number of ones.

2. What is the total number of apples Max has altogether?

3. Max sees 2 bags of ten bananas and 5 loose bananas. How many tens and ones are there?

4. If each apple costs £1, how many pounds does Max need to pay for his 13 apples?

5. Draw a picture of what 2 tens and 4 ones looks like using circles for the items.

Extension challenge: Ask a grown-up to help you find 22 small objects (like pasta pieces or buttons). Can you put them into groups of ten and tell Max how many are left over?
