

A Garden of Many Colours

Learning objective: To understand the importance of diversity and inclusion within a community.

Read the passage carefully, then answer the questions provided. Ensure your answers reflect an understanding of how different perspectives strengthen a group.

In the vibrant meadow of Sunny Patch, a group of friends gathered to plan the annual Summer Festival. Zara the zebra, known for her love of patterns, suggested painting colourful murals. Meanwhile, Max the monkey was busy calculating the budget, noting that they had exactly £45.50 to spend on decorations. Pip the caterpillar, who had just finished reading a book about global traditions, proposed that the festival should feature music and food from every corner of the world.

'If we only do things the way we have always done, we miss out on so much,' Pip explained. Nova the owl agreed, noting that just as a healthy forest needs many different types of trees to flourish, their community was stronger because of their varied talents and backgrounds. When everyone shared their ideas, they realised that their differences were not barriers, but bridges. By listening to one another and including every voice, they created a celebration that was more imaginative than anyone could have planned alone.
