6. 6. True or False: Everyone has unique strengths and talents that contribute to the success of a team. (1 mark)

7. 7. Which of these is an example of showing respect? A) Interrupting someone while they talk. B) Laughing at someone's lunch. C) Listening carefully when a friend shares their story. D) Walking away when someone says hello. Answer: *C (1 mark)

8. 8. True or False: Understanding another person's perspective helps us become more compassionate. (1 mark)

9. 9. If you see someone sitting alone in the playground, what is the most inclusive action? A) Invite them to join your group or chat with them. B) Assume they want to be left alone. C) Wait for someone else to talk to them. D) Go play with your best friend instead. Answer: *A (1 mark)

10. 10. What is the term for the ability to understand and share the feelings of another person? (One-word answer) (1 mark)
