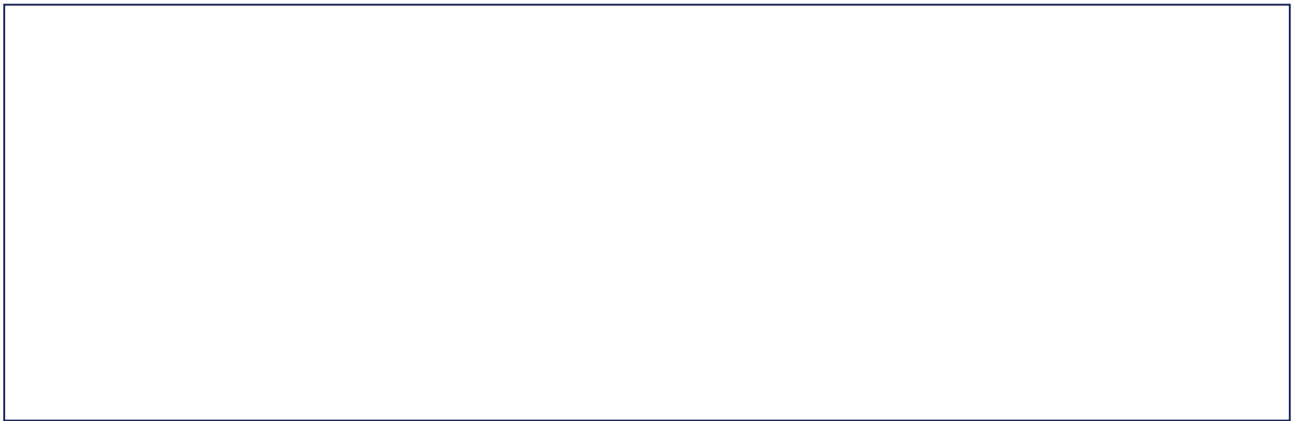
7. 7. True or False: Trust is built when you keep promises and tell the truth. (1 mark)
