10. 10. Max the Monkey wants to share his snacks. If he has £2.00 and buys a pack of fruit for £1.20, how much change does he have, and how does sharing it demonstrate kindness? A) 80p; it shows he is rich. B) 80p; it shows generosity and care for others. C) 90p; it shows he likes fruit. D) 70p; it shows he is hungry. (Select one: *) (1 mark)
