

Kit's Digital Compass: Staying Safe Online

Learning objective: To identify how to stay safe online and understand the importance of keeping personal information private.

Follow the steps to complete your digital safety poster. Use the word bank to label your drawing and ensure you include the key safety features Kit uses to stay protected.

Draw: Draw a scene featuring Kit the fox sitting at a computer desk. In the background, draw a 'Safety Shield' icon. Inside the shield, draw three symbols representing online safety (e.g., a padlock for passwords, a speech bubble for talking to an adult, and a stop sign for blocking). Use vibrant, clear colours and ensure the style is like an educational storyboard.
