Use this scaffold to structure your writing. Start each paragraph with the suggested prompt, then add your own research to explain the importance of Diwali for many people around the world.

4. Food and Community: Discuss the role of sharing meals and sweets. Start with: 'Sharing special food and sweets is a central part of the celebration because...' (2 marks)

5. Conclusion: Summarise the main message of Diwali. Start with: 'Ultimately, Diwali is a time for...' (2 marks)
