

The Festival of Lights: Hanukkah Logic Puzzle

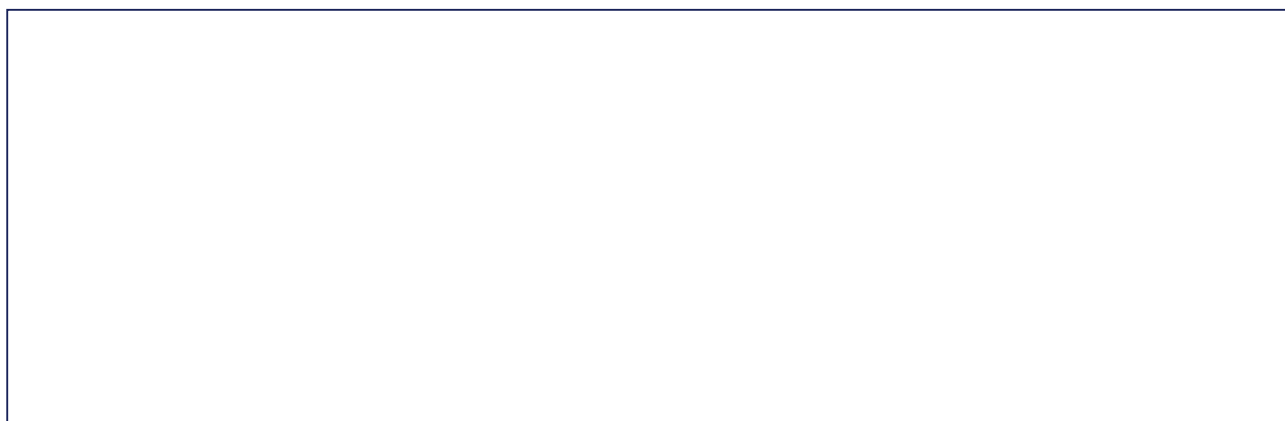
Learning objective: To understand the historical significance, traditions, and symbolism of the Jewish festival of Hanukkah.
