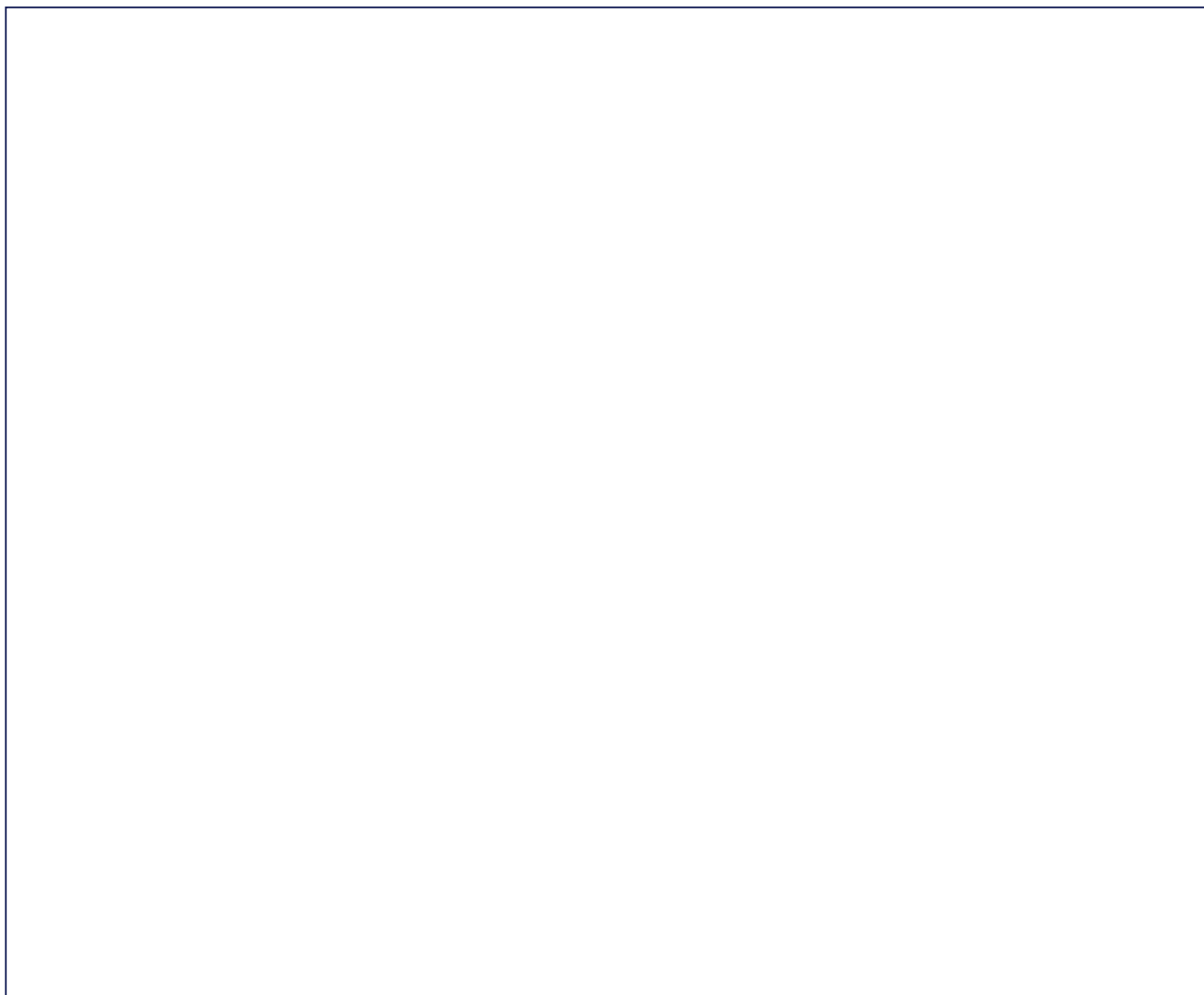


The Tree of Values: A Moral Dilemma Workshop

Learning objective: To explore moral questions and the impact of our choices by visually representing the concepts of integrity, empathy, and consequence.

Use the drawing space below to create your 'Tree of Values'. Think about the choices people make in their daily lives. In the roots, draw the principles that guide us (like honesty). In the branches, draw what grows from good choices. Use the word bank to label your diagram.

Draw: Draw a large, sturdy tree in the centre of the page. The roots should be thick and visible underground. On the roots, write down values like 'Honesty' or 'Fairness'. In the leafy branches, draw symbols of positive outcomes, such as a smiling face, a helping hand, or a heart. Ensure your style is clear and descriptive, using labels to explain your choices.



Label words: Integrity · Empathy · Consequence · Responsibility · Kindness · Choice

Steps:

1. Explain why it is important to consider the feelings of others before making a difficult choice.
2. Compare and contrast a 'selfish' choice with a 'kind' choice. What is the difference in the long-term result?
3. Justify your answer: Is it always easy to know the 'right' thing to do? Why or why not?
4. What might happen if someone made a choice without thinking about the consequences?
5. Label the 'Roots' of your tree with three values that you believe are essential for a happy life.

6. Describe one situation where Zara the Zebra might need to show integrity. How would she show it?
