- A church is a place of worship for Christians, often featuring a steeple or bell tower that signals the start of a service.
- Muslims gather in a mosque, which often includes a minaret—a tall tower used for the call to prayer—and beautiful geometric patterns.
- In a synagogue, Jewish communities read from the Torah, which is kept in a special cabinet called the Ark at the front of the room.
- Hindus visit a Mandir, which can be decorated with bright colours and ornate statues of deities, often featuring a tower called a shikhara.
- A Gurdwara is a place of worship for Sikhs, where the Guru Granth Sahib is treated with great respect and visitors share a meal in the langar kitchen.
