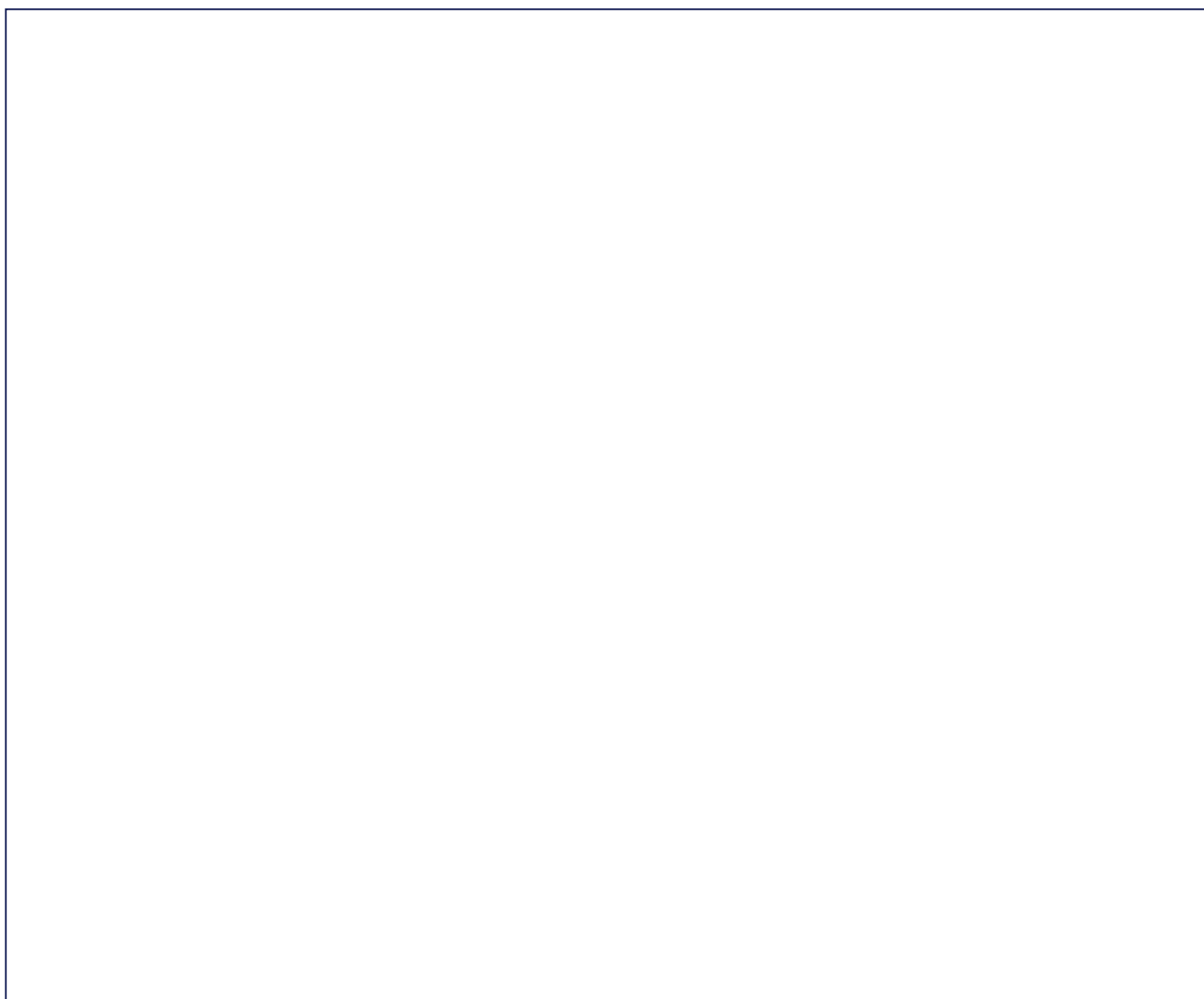


Rosa's Animal Art Gallery

Learning objective: To identify and use Spanish vocabulary for common animals and express simple preferences in Spanish.

Follow the drawing prompt to create your own animal scene. Use the word bank to label your animals in Spanish. Remember to include the correct article (el or la) for each animal.

Draw: Create a vibrant scene featuring at least four different animals from the word bank. Draw them in a setting where they might be found (for example: a forest, a house, or a jungle). Use a colourful, artistic style. Once your drawing is complete, draw lines pointing to each animal and write the correct Spanish label from the word bank next to it.



Label words: el perro (dog) · el gato (cat) · el pájaro (bird) · el conejo (rabbit) · el león (lion) · la tortuga (tortoise) · la serpiente (snake) · el elefante (elephant)

Steps:

1. Choose two animals from your drawing. Write a sentence for each using 'Mi animal favorito es...' (My favourite animal is...)
2. What is the difference between 'el' and 'la' when labelling your animals in Spanish?
3. If you were to add an adjective to 'el león', what word would you use and what does it mean in English?
4. Label the animal in your drawing that lives in the ocean using its Spanish name.

5. Translate 'The cat is big' into Spanish. (Hint: 'es grande' means 'is big').
