

Year 5 Spanish Assessment: Colores

Learning objective: To identify, spell, and apply Spanish colour vocabulary in context.

Read each question carefully. Rosa the parrot has provided a word bank to help you. Write your answers in the spaces provided.

Rosa the parrot is painting a mural of her garden. She uses 'rojo' for the roses, 'verde' for the leaves, 'amarillo' for the sun, and 'azul' for the sky. She loves to describe the world around her in Spanish!

Word bank: rojo · azul · amarillo · verde · naranja · morado · rosa · blanco · negro · gris · marrón

1. Translate the following colours into Spanish: 1. Red, 2. Blue, 3. Yellow, 4. Green. (4 marks)

2. If a cloud is 'blanco' and a crow is 'negro', what do these words mean in English? (2 marks)

3. Rosa is painting a sunset. She uses 'naranja' and 'morado'. Describe what these colours are in English. (2 marks)

4. Max the monkey has a brown banana and a grey stone. Write the correct Spanish adjectives for these objects. (2 marks)

5. Explain why Spanish adjectives sometimes change their ending (e.g., 'rojo' vs 'roja'). Give an example. (4 marks)

6. Creative Writing: Rosa is painting a magical forest. Write 5 sentences in Spanish describing the colours of the trees, the flowers, the river, the sky, and a bird. (Example: 'El árbol es verde.') (11 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of a magical garden based on your sentences in the final question. Label at least three items using their Spanish colour names.
