

Spanish Assessment: Los Días de la Semana with Rosa the Parrot

Learning objective: To recall, spell, and apply the days of the week in Spanish and understand their sequence.

Read each question carefully. Rosa the parrot is here to help you remember your vocabulary! Write your answers clearly in the spaces provided.

Rosa the parrot has a very busy schedule! She practises her Spanish songs on Mondays, reads history books with Ellie on Wednesdays, and flies to the park with Max on Saturdays. To keep her diary organised, she always writes the day of the week in Spanish.

1. 1. Write the correct Spanish word for 'Monday' and 'Friday'. (2 marks)

2. 2. Rosa says: 'Hoy es martes.' Translate this sentence into English. (2 marks)

3. 3. Fill in the missing days in this sequence: Lunes, _____, Miércoles, _____, Viernes. (2 marks)

4. 4. Which two days of the week in Spanish start with the letter 'm'? List them both. (2 marks)

5. 5. Why do Spanish days of the week start with a lowercase letter (e.g., 'lunes')? Explain the difference between English and Spanish conventions for writing these words. (3 marks)

6. 6. Compare and contrast the Spanish words for the weekend (sábado and domingo) with the rest of the week. What do you notice about their spelling or sounds? (4 marks)

7. 7. Rosa wants to plan her week. Write a short paragraph (3-4 sentences) in Spanish describing what she does on three different days. Include the days and simple actions (e.g., 'El lunes, Rosa canta'). (5 marks)

8. 8. Justify your answer: If today is 'viernes', what will tomorrow be? Write your answer in a full Spanish sentence. (3 marks)

Draw: Draw a calendar for Rosa the parrot. Label each box with the correct Spanish day of the week and add a small icon showing what she might do on that day (e.g., a book for reading).



Extension challenge: Imagine you are Rosa. What might happen if the days of the week were in a different order? Would it change your routine? Write a creative explanation of why the current sequence is important for keeping the world organised. Total: /25
