

Spanish Assessment: Mi Familia (My Family)

Learning objective: To identify and describe family members in Spanish and use possessive adjectives correctly.

Read each question carefully. Write your answers in the spaces provided. Ensure you use the correct articles (el/la/los/las) where necessary.

Rosa the parrot is showing us her family photo album. She says: '¡Hola! This is my family. My father is called Carlos and my mother is called Elena. I have one brother named Luis and one sister named Ana. My grandfather is called Jorge and my grandmother is called María.'

2. Translate the following family members into Spanish: 1. Grandmother, 2. Brother, 3. Uncle, 4. Cousin. (4 marks)

3. Fill in the blanks using 'mi' (my) to complete the sentences: 1. ____ padre es amable. 2. ____ hermana es divertida. (2 marks)

4. Explain why we use 'la' before 'abuela' but 'el' before 'abuelo'. (4 marks)

5. If a family meal costs £15.50 and you pay with a £20 note, how much change do you receive? Write the answer in English and then write the word for 'family' in Spanish. (3 marks)

6. Write a short paragraph (5-6 sentences) in Spanish describing your own family. Include their names, what they are called (using 'se llama'), and one adjective for each (e.g., alto/a, bajo/a, inteligente). (10 marks)

Draw: Draw a family tree of four people. Label each person in Spanish using the correct vocabulary (e.g., 'mi padre', 'mi hermana').
