

Year 5 Spanish Assessment: Greetings and Introductions

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding of Spanish greetings, introductions, and polite conversation.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank provided if you need help with spelling. Write your answers clearly in the spaces provided.

Rosa the parrot is visiting a school in Madrid. She is meeting new friends and learning how to greet them politely at different times of the day. Help Rosa practise her Spanish!

5. Rosa is leaving her friend's house in the evening. Provide two different ways she could say 'goodbye' in Spanish. (2 marks) (2 marks)

6. 6. You are introduced to a new friend. Write a short dialogue (at least 4 sentences) in Spanish where you greet them, ask their name, say your name, and say 'nice to meet you'. (5 marks) (5 marks)

7. 7. Why is it important to use formal or polite greetings when meeting someone new? (4 marks) (4 marks)

8. 8. Translate the following phrase into English: 'Mucho gusto'. (3 marks) (3 marks)
