

¡Los Números! Rosa's Spanish Number Guide

Count along with Rosa the Parrot and master your Spanish numbers from zero to twenty!

- The number 'cinco' represents the quantity of five items, such as five colourful feathers on Rosa's wing.
- Spanish numbers from 11 to 15 have unique names: once, doce, trece, catorce, and quince.
- To say 16 in Spanish, you write 'dieciséis', which includes a written accent mark over the letter 'e'.
- The number 20 is written as 'veinte', which serves as the base for building larger numbers later on.
- All numbers in Spanish are nouns, which helps you count objects like books, pencils, or stars in the night sky.

Did you know? Did you know? In Spanish, numbers 16 through 19 are formed by combining 'diez' (ten) with the other number! 'Dieciséis' literally translates to 'ten and six'. It is like a clever mathematical code hidden inside the language!
