

Year 5 Spanish Assessment: Numbers and Quantities

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding of Spanish cardinal numbers from 0 to 100, including simple addition and currency application.

Read each question carefully. Rosa the Parrot is here to help you remember your vocabulary! Write your answers clearly in the spaces provided. Total marks available: 25.

Rosa the Parrot has been shopping at the market to find fruit for her friends. She is counting her coins in Spanish to make sure she has enough money to pay for her snacks.

1. Write the Spanish word for these numbers: 12 and 15. (2 marks)

2. Translate the following sum into Spanish words: $20 + 10 = 30$. (e.g., 'Twenty plus ten equals thirty'). (3 marks)

3. If Rosa has 45 pence and she spends 20 pence, how much does she have left? Write the answer in Spanish words. (3 marks)

4. Write the correct Spanish number for: 56, 72, and 89. (6 marks)

5. Rosa wants to buy a bunch of grapes that costs 64 pence. Explain in Spanish how you would say the number 64 using the word 'y'. (6 marks)

6. Extended Writing: Rosa is hosting a party for 100 forest friends. Write a short paragraph (3-4 sentences) in Spanish describing how many friends are coming and mentioning two items they might eat, using numbers you have learned today. (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a basket containing exactly 34 apples and label the quantity in Spanish.
