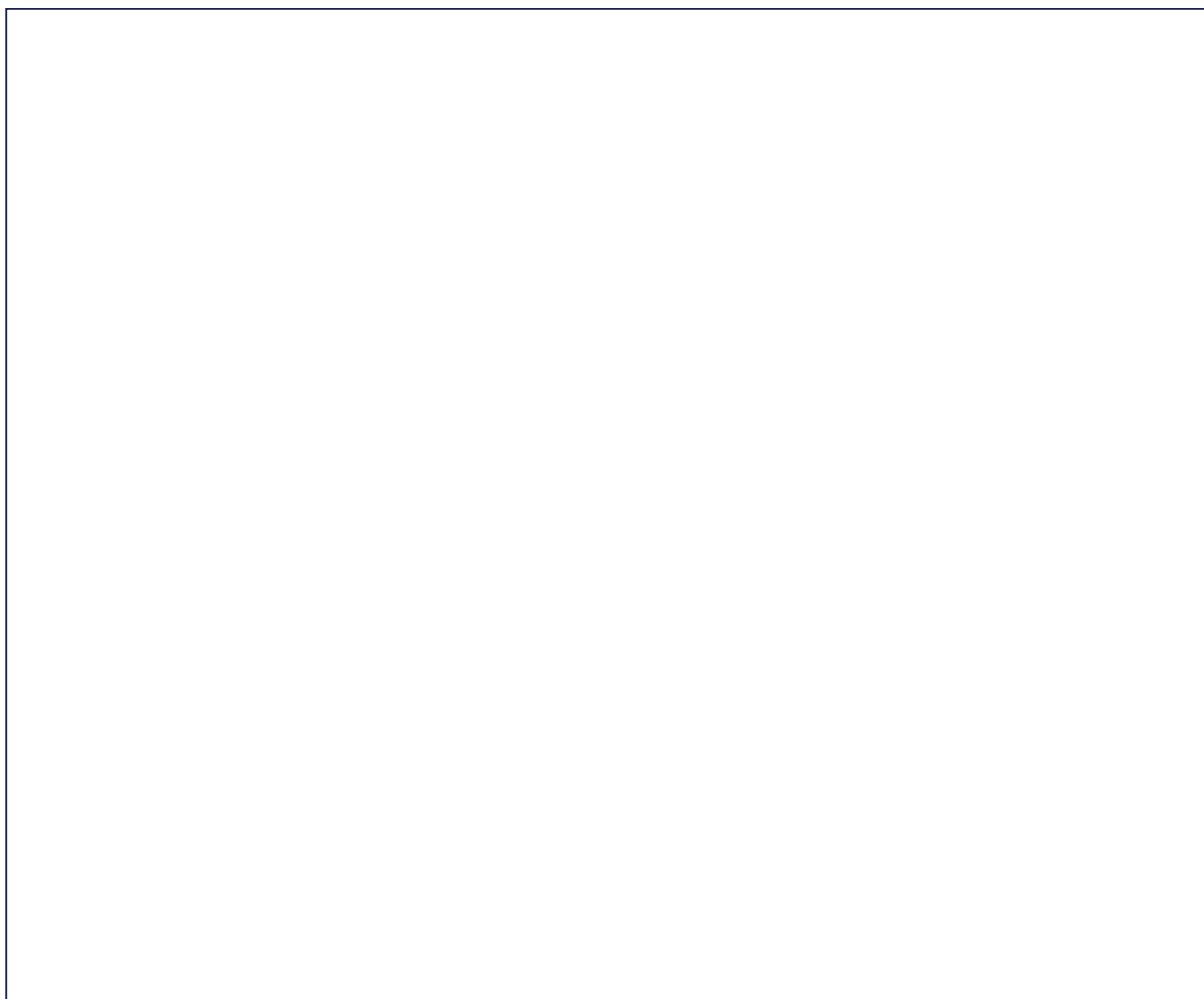


Rosa's Spanish Art Gallery

Learning objective: To express opinions in Spanish using phrases such as 'Me gusta', 'No me gusta', and 'Me encanta'.

Rosa the parrot is curating her own art gallery! Use the word bank to label your drawings with the correct Spanish opinion phrases. Choose your favourite things to draw in the frames provided.

Draw: Draw a large, colourful art gallery wall with three empty picture frames. Inside each frame, draw a simple scene (a piece of fruit, a hobby, and a silly object like a dancing broccoli). Use a clean, cartoon style with clear space around each frame to write your Spanish labels.



Label words: Me gusta (I like) · No me gusta (I do not like) · Me encanta (I love) · ¡Qué bien! (How good!)

Steps:

1. Draw a piece of fruit you love in the first frame and write 'Me encanta' underneath it.
2. Draw an activity you enjoy (like football or reading) in the second frame and write 'Me gusta' next to it.
3. Draw something you really do not like in the third frame and write 'No me gusta' above it.
4. If you saw a beautiful painting in the gallery, which phrase from the word bank would you use to show you think it is great?
5. Why is it important to learn different ways to share our opinions in a new language?
