

Year 5 Spanish Assessment: Expressing Opinions

Learning objective: To confidently use and understand Spanish opinion phrases to describe likes and dislikes regarding food, hobbies, and school subjects.

Read each question carefully. Write your answers in Spanish where requested. Rosa the Parrot is here to help you remember your vocabulary!

Rosa the parrot is talking to her friends about their favourite things. She says: '¡Hola! I love talking about what I enjoy. For example: Me encanta el chocolate porque es delicioso. But, no me gusta el brócoli porque es aburrido.'

Word bank: Me gusta... (I like...) · Me encanta... (I love...) · No me gusta... (I do not like...) · Odio... (I hate...) · porque es... (because it is...) · divertido/a (fun) · aburrido/a (boring) · delicioso/a (delicious) · interesante (interesting)

1. Translate the following phrases into English: 1) Me encanta el fútbol. 2) No me gusta la pizza. (2 marks)

2. Fill in the blank to complete the sentence: 'Me _____ las matemáticas porque son interesantes.' (I like maths because they are interesting.) (2 marks)

3. If you wanted to say 'I hate homework because it is boring', how would you write that in Spanish? Use the word bank to help you. (4 marks)

4. Explain the difference between 'Me gusta' and 'Me encanta'. When would you use one instead of the other? (4 marks)

5. Read this statement: 'Me gusta la música porque es divertida.' Rewrite this sentence to express a negative opinion about music using the same structure. (3 marks)

6. Extended Writing Task: Write a short paragraph (3-5 sentences) about three different things you like or dislike. You must use at least two different opinion phrases and explain your reasons using 'porque'. (10 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of yourself doing an activity you love and write a speech bubble in Spanish that says 'Me encanta...' followed by the activity.
