

Mi Colegio: My School Drawing Activity

Learning objective: To identify and use Spanish vocabulary related to school subjects and classroom items.

Follow the drawing prompt to create your own classroom scene. Then, use the word bank to label your items in Spanish.

Draw: Draw a bright and colourful classroom scene. Include a desk with a backpack (la mochila) resting against it. On the desk, draw an open notebook (el cuaderno) and a pencil (el lápiz). On the wall, draw a large whiteboard (la pizarra) with some sums written on it to show it is a maths lesson. Include Rosa the parrot perched on a chair, watching the lesson with interest. Use a clean, cartoon-style illustration technique.



Label words: la mochila (backpack) · el cuaderno (notebook) · el lápiz (pencil) · la clase de matemáticas (maths class) · la clase de arte (art class) · el profesor (teacher) · la pizarra (whiteboard)

Steps:

1. Label your drawing with 'el cuaderno' and 'el lápiz'. In which class would you use these most often?
2. Rosa the parrot is visiting your classroom! Draw her near the whiteboard. What is the Spanish word for 'whiteboard'?
3. If you are drawing a scene for 'la clase de arte', what three art supplies should you add to the table?
4. Translate 'My school' into Spanish.

5. Why is it helpful to have 'la mochila' in a school setting? Write your answer in English.
