- The word for maths in Spanish is 'las matemáticas'. Use this in a sentence to say 'I like maths': 'Me gustan las matemáticas'.
- A classroom is called 'la clase'. If you want to say 'in the class', you say 'en la clase'.
- Your pencil case is 'el estuche'. Can you find the Spanish word for book? It is 'el libro'.
- To describe your teacher, use 'el profesor' (male) or 'la profesora' (female).
- Physical Education is known as 'la educación física'. It is one of the most popular subjects in Spain!
- Practise your verbs: 'Escribir' means to write, and 'leer' means to read. Both are essential for your lessons!

Did you know? Did you know? In many Spanish-speaking schools, students often use the word 'colegio' for primary school and 'instituto' for secondary school. Also, students often address their teachers as 'Don' (for men) or 'Doña' (for women) followed by their first name—a sign of respect that is a lovely part of their culture!
