

Rosa's School Day Adventure (Mi Día Escolar)

Learning objective: To be able to name school subjects and classroom items in Spanish, and express opinions about them using 'me gusta' or 'no me gusta'.

Read the questions carefully and use the word bank to help you complete the sentences in Spanish. Rosa the parrot is excited to see how you use your new vocabulary!

Word bank: las matemáticas (maths) · el inglés (English) · las ciencias (science) · el arte (art) · el lápiz (pencil) · el libro (book) · me gusta (I like) · no me gusta (I do not like) · fácil (easy) · difícil (difficult)

1. Rosa is looking at her school timetable. Write a sentence in Spanish to say: 'I like maths'. (2 marks)

2. Look at the word bank. If you find a subject very hard to learn, which word would you use to describe it? Write a full sentence saying 'Science is difficult' in Spanish. (2 marks)

3. Translate the following classroom items into Spanish: A pencil and a book. (2 marks)

4. Imagine you are talking to Rosa. Write a sentence expressing your opinion about 'el arte' (art) using 'me gusta' or 'no me gusta'. (2 marks)

5. Why is it important to learn the names of school subjects in another language? Give one reason. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw your favourite school subject in a frame. Inside the frame, draw yourself doing that subject and write a small speech bubble in Spanish saying 'Me gusta...' followed by the subject name.



Extension challenge: Write three sentences about your school day in Spanish. Include one subject you like, one you don't like, and one item you have in your pencil case.
