

Rosa's Market Adventure: A Spanish Shopping Assessment

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding of Spanish vocabulary related to shopping, prices, and quantities.

Read each question carefully. Write your answers in Spanish where requested. Remember to use the correct currency format when calculating totals.

Rosa the parrot is visiting the local market. She wants to buy a loaf of bread for £2, three apples for £3, and a basket for £4. She has a £10 note in her purse.

Word bank: ¿Cuánto cuesta? · La manzana · El pan · Barato · Caro · Cinco libras · La tienda · Comprar

1. Translate the following shopping items into Spanish: 1. The bread, 2. The apple. (2 marks)

2. Rosa asks the shopkeeper the price of the bread. Write the Spanish phrase she would use to ask 'How much does it cost?'. (2 marks)

3. Calculate the total cost of Rosa's items (bread, apples, and basket). Write the total in words in Spanish (e.g., 'Nine pounds'). (4 marks)

4. If Rosa buys all three items, how much change will she receive from her £10 note? Show your working in £. (4 marks)

5. Explain in two sentences why it is important to know the words for 'expensive' (caro) and 'cheap' (barato) when shopping at a market. (8 marks)

6. Write a short dialogue (5 lines) in Spanish between Rosa and the shopkeeper. Rosa should greet the shopkeeper, ask for the apples, and say thank you. (5 marks)

Draw: Draw Rosa the parrot at the market stall. Include labels for the items she is buying, written in Spanish.
