

Shopping in Spain with Rosa the Parrot

Learning objective: To learn and apply vocabulary related to shopping, prices, and food items in Spanish, using currency in Australian dollars and cents.

Read the questions carefully and use the word bank to help you complete the sentences and calculations. Remember to write your answers in Spanish where required.

Rosa the parrot is visiting a local market. She wants to buy some fruit and bread for her friends. She needs to check the prices and talk to the shopkeeper in Spanish.

Word bank: ¿Cuánto cuesta? · la manzana · el pan · la tienda · barato · caro · la cuenta

1. Rosa wants to ask the price of an item. Which Spanish phrase should she use? Write it below. (1 mark)

2. Translate these items into Spanish: 'The apple' and 'The bread'. (2 marks)

3. Rosa sees a loaf of bread for £1.20 and an apple for £0.50. Calculate the total cost of these two items in Australian dollars and cents. (2 marks)

4. If an item costs £5.00 but is usually £10.00, would you describe it as 'barato' (cheap) or 'caro' (expensive)? Explain your choice. (2 marks)

5. Rosa is at the end of her shopping trip. Write the Spanish term for 'the bill' or 'the check' that she needs to ask for. (1 mark)

Draw: Draw a small Spanish market stall with Rosa the parrot standing behind it. Include labels in Spanish for at least three items on the stall.



Extension challenge: Imagine you have £10.00 to spend at a Spanish market. Create a simple shopping list of 4 items with their prices in £, and write a short sentence in Spanish stating what you are going to buy (e.g., 'Voy a comprar...').
