

Rosa's Spanish Verb Adventure: Mastering Tenses

Learning objective: To understand and conjugate high-frequency Spanish verbs in the present tense, and recognise the difference between infinitive and conjugated forms.

Use these flashcards to practise Spanish verbs with Rosa the Parrot. On the front, you will find the infinitive form or a conjugation task. On the back, you will find the translation and the correct form. Practise daily to master your Spanish vocabulary!

What is an 'Infinitive' verb in Spanish?

An infinitive is the base form of a verb, ending in -ar, -er, or -ir (e.g., hablar).

How do you say 'to speak' in Spanish?

Hablar.

Translate: 'Yo hablo' into English.

I speak.

What is the English translation for the verb 'comer'?

To eat.

How do you conjugate 'comer' for 'yo' (I)?

Yo como.

Translate: 'Vivir' into English.

To live.

How do you conjugate 'hablar' for 'tú' (you)?

Tú hablas.

What is the difference between an infinitive and a conjugated verb?

An infinitive is the 'to' form; a conjugated verb is adjusted to show who is doing the action.

Translate: 'Nosotros comemos' into English.

We eat.

Which ending does the verb 'vivir' have?

-ir.

Translate into Spanish: 'I live'.

Yo vivo.

What is the 'Present Tense' used for?

It is used to describe actions happening now or habits that occur regularly.
