

Rosa's Weather Journal: El Tiempo

Learning objective: To identify and use Spanish vocabulary for different weather conditions to describe a scene.

Rosa the parrot wants to record the weather for her travel diary. Follow the instructions to create your weather landscape and label the items in Spanish.

Draw: Create a landscape divided into four sections. In the first section, draw a bright, sunny scene. In the second section, show a cloudy, windy day with trees bending. In the third section, draw a rainy scene with puddles. In the final section, draw a high mountain top covered in snow. Use bright colours and clear lines to separate each weather type.



Label words: Hace sol (It is sunny) · Hace frío (It is cold) · Hace calor (It is hot) · Llueve (It is raining) · Nieva (It is snowing) · Está nublado (It is cloudy) · Hace viento (It is windy)

Steps:

1. Draw a bright sun in the sky and label it 'Hace sol'.
2. Draw a cloud covering part of the sun and label it 'Está nublado'.
3. Draw some raindrops falling from a cloud and label it 'Llueve'.
4. Draw a snowy mountain peak and label it 'Nieva'.
5. If Rosa is flying in a place where it is very cold, which phrase from the word bank should she use? Write it

below.
