6. If you want to show that a dragon's scales are rough, you are focusing on: A) Texture* B) Hue C) Symmetry D) Scale (1 mark)

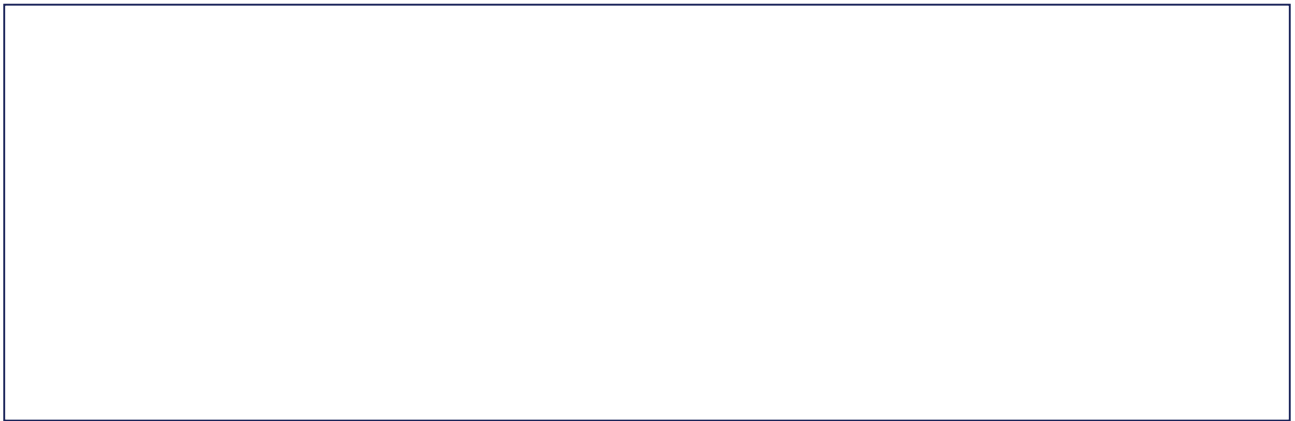
7. Which word describes the material used by an artist, such as charcoal, watercolours, or pastels? (One word) (1 mark)

Draw: Imagine you are illustrating a scene for a story about an enchanted library. Draw the library using 'perspective' to make the bookshelves look like they stretch on forever. Add 'texture' to the floor and walls to show what materials they are made of.



Extension challenge: Justify your answer: If you were illustrating a book about a sad, rainy day, which colour palette would you choose and why? Compare and contrast how using watercolours might change the mood of the scene compared to using bold, black ink pens. Explain why an artist might choose to leave large amounts of 'negative space' (empty space) on a book cover design.
