Learning objective: To understand the properties of fabrics, joining techniques, and the design process for textile products.

Help Max the monkey solve these textile puzzles! Read each question carefully and select or write the best answer. Remember, textiles are all about choosing the right material for the right job.

Answer Key: 1.C, 2.True, 3.Synthetic, 4.A, 5.Stitch, 6.False, 7.Appliqué, 8.B, 9.Template, 10.A. Textiles are materials made from fibres. Natural fibres come from plants or animals, while synthetic fibres are man-made. Designers use templates to ensure accuracy when cutting fabric.
