Learning objective: To identify and use adjectives to describe nouns and enhance writing.

Read the passage below carefully and answer the questions. Make sure to use evidence from the text where required.

Max the monkey decided to visit the local market to buy ingredients for a fruity salad. He bounced along the dusty path, his long, bushy tail twitching with excitement. 1. Find two adjectives in the text used to describe the apples. (2 marks)

2. How much did Max pay for the three apples? (1 mark)

3. Why do you think the peaches felt 'ticklish' to Max? (2 marks)

4. What does the phrase 'bumpy, green limes' tell you about the fruit? (2 marks)

5. If you were going to the market, which piece of fruit would you buy and why? Use an adjective in your answer. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw Max the monkey carrying his woven basket filled with the fruit he bought at the market. Try to show the different textures of the fruit, like the fuzzy peaches or bumpy limes.
