Add some sparkle to your sentences with brilliant adverbs!

- An adverb is a word that modifies a verb, telling us more about the action.
- Adverbs of manner explain HOW an action is performed, such as 'The lion roared loudly'.
- Adverbs of time tell us WHEN an action happens, like 'We will visit the library today'.
- Adverbs of place tell us WHERE an action takes place, for example, 'Pip looked everywhere for his book'.
- Adverbs of frequency tell us HOW OFTEN an action occurs, such as 'Bea always flies to the flowers'.
- You can spot adverbs by looking for words that describe the action verb in your sentence.

Did you know? Did you know? Most adverbs that describe 'how' something is done end in the suffix '-ly'. For example, if Max the monkey climbs a tree, he doesn't just climb; he climbs 'quickly' or 'carefully'!
